Many of the benefits have additional eligibility requirements.

THIS IS WHAT WE DO

Marlene Sorenson gave a presentation at our August Post 59 meeting. She and her husband, Kenton, are co-founders of "Zeteo Community" - Zeteo is affiliated with similar organizations and programs throughout the U.S. aiming to provide "residential reprogramming" and recovery resources for women who have suffered the trauma of sexual abuse and trafficking. An \$ 8 million dollar campus is envisioned in Dane County; an immediate goal is to raise \$ 400,000 to construct two 'hope healing homes' which will temporarily house victims and provide them with resources to recover and renew their lives. Marlene asks that we spread the word...and financial assistance is welcomed. We have shared this with our affiliates and anticipate a subcommittee will be formed to plan means of support. Ideas and energy will be welcomed.

Stoughton High School Juniors Simon Mehring and Jackson Mueller were selected as 2024 Badger Boys delegates, representing our community. The Badger Boys State Program, offered in June on the University of Wisconsin Eau Claire campus, promotes the principles and practice of good government and citizenship. It encourages active participation in the civic, commercial, social and moral welfare of our community. It helps lay the groundwork for our future leaders.

As co-sponsors, with the Stoughton Lions organization, we will be anxious to learn of their participation and response to this program. They and their family will be our special guests at our October 22nd dinner. Following the meal, we will ask Simon and Jackson to briefly share their experiences with attendees. Parents will be welcome to speak to this as well. See you then.

The late Shirley Linnerud and her family have been unequaled supporters of our organization. Shirley strongly advocated for the American Way - that of courage, honor, patriotism and service. We have thus named our Post 59 scholarships "The American Legion Shirley Linnerud Memorial Scholarships". The Stoughton High School honors committee selected two seniors this past May that personified these qualities: Ruby Royston and Lily Tuttle.
