

Sons of the American Legion

I just wanted to take a few minutes of your time to let you know what The Sons of the American Legion is all about.

Founded in 1932, Sons of The American Legion exists to honor the service and sacrifice of Legionnaires.

S.A.L. members include males of all ages whose parents or grandparents served in the U.S. military and were eligible for American Legion membership. Members of The American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary and Sons of The American Legion comprise the Legion Family, which has a combined membership of nearly 4.2 million.

Although Sons has its own membership, the organization is not a separate entity. Rather, S.A.L. is a program of The American Legion. Many Legionnaires hold dual membership in S.A.L.

The Sons organization is divided into detachments at the state level and squadrons at the local level. A squadron pairs with a local American Legion post; a squadron's charter is contingent upon its parent post's charter. However, squadrons can determine the extent of their services to the community, state and nation. They are permitted flexibility in planning programs and activities to meet their needs, but must remember S.A.L.'s mission: to strengthen the four pillars of The American Legion. Therefore, squadrons' campaigns place an emphasis on preserving American traditions and values, improving the quality of life for our nation's children, caring for veterans and their families, and teaching the fundamentals of good citizenship.

The mission of the Sons is to support veterans and their families and the policies of our parent organization, The American Legion. Virtually everything that involves the Sons could be grouped under three areas: 1) support for veterans and their families, 2) promoting patriotism and Americanism and 3) promoting programs which benefit the youth of our country.

We have been working very hard to get our Post 59 Sons of the American Legion Squadron to where we should be. We encourage all of our members to join our meeting which is held on the 2nd Wednesday of each month at The Legion.

Stoughton Area Veterans Memorial Park

The Stoughton Area Veterans Memorial Park will be located on Hwy B and Country Club Road just north on Stoughton. The land for the memorial was generously donated by Oscar and Shirley Linnerud. The park will face south toward Hwy B and will be approximately 2.38 acres in size. The entrance to the park will feature a monument to thank major contributors for their part in making the park possible. The goal of the park design is for it to be educational and informative, but still sacred and peaceful in honoring our military personnel. Pechmann Memorials, American Legion Post 59, VFW Post 328, as well as members from the community worked together to approve the design concept.

The first part of the memorial was created to offer an opportunity for both learning and reflection. It will offer six flags, which are available for sponsorship, to honor the branches of service. These are the flags of the Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, and Coast Guard. There will also be a flag for the Merchant Marines who have proudly served our nation since the Revolutionary War. Also in this area will be six foot pillars, along each side, which will highlight brief synopsis of the major wars, the Gettysburg address, as well as significant battles and speeches. In addition, there will be multiple patio areas with pavers and benches that will be available for sponsorship

and offer personalized engraving. The sale of these items will allow individuals, groups, and businesses to help fund the project and give a lasting salute in remembrance of all veterans.

The main area of the memorial is a patio in the shape of the Pentagon, in honor of the Department of Defense. The employees and military personnel of the Department of Defense work daily to form policies and practices to ensure our safety and the safety of our armed forces. This main area is kept distinct from the educational portion to offer a space for more private reflection. The points of the pentagon will feature five additional flags--the U.S., the State of Wisconsin, American Legion, VFW, and the POW/Mia flags. Going toward the center are five rows of black granite panels that will be used to list the names of veterans from the Stoughton area who have served in the military. In the center of the patio will be an eagle with a wing span of 4-6 feet mounted on a pentagon. This pentagon will list the names of all military personnel, from the Stoughton area, who were killed in action or are missing in action. Additionally, the eagle is a symbol of freedomfreedom that we have been privileged to have because of the service and sacrifices of our veterans and their families.


A MESSAGE FROM THE VIDALIA ONION CHAIRPERSONS:


We are writing this letter to inform all the members that Wendell Ott and I have volunteer to resume the duties of the chairmanship of the Annual Vidalia Onion Sale.
