

Update on Graeme McCrosson

One year ago, on Veteran's Day, November 11th, 2019, our Auxiliary Member, Michele McCrosson and her six-year-old son, Graeme, were in a horrible weather-related motor vehicle accident. You may recall seeing our <u>post on Facebook</u> awhile back or hearing about it from other members or friends.

Graeme suffered a severe traumatic brain injury. Since that day, Graeme had multiple surgeries at the American Family Children's Hospital. After months at the hospital he moved to the Central Wisconsin Rehab Center where he is today. He recently turned seven years old, but his family was not allowed into the facility due to an outbreak of the virus. He is progressing well thru multiple therapies including Physical, Occupational, Speech, Dietary and others. He works very hard every day. When he does get home the work will not stop. The hope is that he may be able to go home before Thanksgiving.

The American Legion Post 59, the SAL and our Auxiliary Unit have made donations to Graeme's fund to help with his recovery. His Dad, Curtis is an Afghanistan Veteran and Legion member.

We were able to help the family set up a donation fund at the Blackhawk Credit Union in Graeme's name which some of you may have already donated to.


Squadron 59 Membership Update

VETERANS MEMORIAL

Last month, the names of ninety-two Stoughton area veterans were added to the black granite walls of the veteran memorial. They include the names of those who recently joined the armed services; those who have recently moved into the area, as well as those whose names were missed earlier. This brings the total number of Stoughton area men and women who have served in the United States armed forces to 5739, dating back to the Civil War.

Almost all the fund-raising activities for the upkeep and maintenance of the memorial have been curtailed due to Covid-19. Maintenance costs, however, are on-going. Any donation toward this cause would be appreciated.

The memorial park will close in mid-November and reopen in the spring.

LOCAL VIETNAM VETERAN HONORS CIVIL WAR UNCLE

On October 6, Doug Olson, a Stoughton resident and Post 59 member, helped set the stone for his great grand uncle, Cpl. James Croft, who was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor* for heroism during the Civil War. Cpl. Croft was wounded in the battle of Allatoona Pass, Georgia, on October 5, 1864.

The 200 pound granite stone was placed in the Oak Hill cemetery in Janesville, Wisconsin.

According to Vietnam veteran, Doug Olson, "my great grand uncle was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor for his actions during the Civil War. Until recently, there was no marker recognizing his military achievement. I, along with other descendants of Cpl. Croft, worked with the Congressional Medal of Honor Society to honor him. The Croft/Scott/Olson family has been a fixture in the Stoughton area for over 100 years and its military history predates the Revolutionary War".

The original gravestone, which remains in place, contained only Croft's name and years of birth and death.

*The Congressional Medal of Honor is the highest and most prestigious personal military decoration awarded to U.S. military service members for acts of valor.
